The photo of the sign has also been posted on Facebook, and has, as they say, "gone viral", being shared on almost thirty new pages and being "liked" too many times to count, all because we were willing to speak a message that reaches others with the radical, inclusive welcome of the Gospel.

How is it that the Church (the larger Church) has become associated with words that divide? If the Church sings and says and in other ways professes the love of God, how can it then even begin to suggest that God's love does not reach to every single person?

I am so grateful to serve at Luther Memorial, where the expansive love of Christ reaches out beyond ourselves. It is not always easy to live out our mission statement of "Actively Sharing Christ's Love in Community", but when we do, we are sharing the Gospel message.

It can be especially difficult to stay centered in the Gospel message when the messages around us are full of suspicion, judgment, divisiveness, and yes, even hatred. This seems particularly true around election time. And yet, if we can imagine ourselves filtering our speech through Christ's love....which embraces every person....how much more are we then actively sharing that love?

It also occurs to me that the message on our reader board was a form of Evangelism....a word Lutherans love but dread putting into practice. But we didn't have to knock on doors or assault people with pointed questions...instead we simply offered a hopeful word in an interesting way. I think that's what Jesus did, too, throughout the gospels, in parables and stories.

Beloved community, let's reach out with love and compassion to our neighbors...to community wherever it is found. Let's be reminded that we do believe in the separation of church and hate.

Almost everything that is represented by a logo sees that image change as the organization and the community around it evolve. Think back to

logos of organizations, businesses, and even



congregations. Here's how Kentucky Fried over the years: For many years,

Luther Memorial has been represented by a simple cross in a triangle, designed by Ed Ehret. In keeping with the times, this well designed creation told something of the story of this congregation.

With that design in mind, Luther Memorial commissioned Christy Watson, who is a graphic designer, our web master, (and Paul and Karen Olsen's daughter) to update our logo and the materials that surround it.

Christy's design exemplifies the mission and ministry here at LMLC. Prominent in the logo is the cross, reminding us of our faith in Jesus Chicken's logo evolved Christ, crucified and risen. The cross is white, which is a color of hope and of the Easter season. In addition, the placement of the cross reminds us that Jesus is the center of all that we do.

> The rectangular shaped background is divided into two rotated triangles. One echoes the rock wall in our sanctuary and the solid foundation upon which our faith is built. The other echoes the dusky blue color that is present in our sanctuary as well as the blue of sky and water, reminding us of the goodness of all Creation.

> The typeface is a modern typeface, suggesting LMLC's commitment to carrying the Gospel into the future. The prominent M's whose mid points reach the base line, are faint allusions to triangles. The lower case "lutheran church" is a very modern touch.



Where are the LBWs??

In 2005 the ELCA debuted a new hymnal... Evangelical Lutheran Worship. The ELCA notes that ELW was developed as, "a new and common approach to primary worship resources that are supportive of the entire ELCA for the next generation. It is important to remember that Evangelical Lutheran Worship is not so much comprehensive as it is core. It will provide a grounded center that presents the breadth of a living tradition, a common treasury that reminds us that in Jesus Christ we are held together. As the primary worship book of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and of




the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, Evangelical Lutheran Worship will contribute to the sense that congregations are connected, a communion of local assemblies sharing in the same mission of God." ©

At the recommendation of the Worship Committee, your Church Council approved the transition to ELW for Luther Memorial. We have already been utilizing this resource through its online materials, but now we will have the hymnals available in the pews.

Through the gifts of two Memorial funds, we have seed money for the initial purchase of hymnals. The congregation is invited to donate hymnals in honor or memory of loved ones. This opportunity will begin to be available in October, and we anticipate the arrival of the ELWs in time for the beginning of a new church year in Advent.

What about the LBWs? Those LBWs that were donated in honor or memory of individuals will be available for those families to take home. Additional LBWs will be available for purchase at a cost of a \$5 donation toward the purchase of ELWs. This will all take place on **September 16, 23, and 30** in Katie's Parish.


the learning curve. Beginning this next leg of our time together, I am reminded of this prayer from the LBW's Evening Prayer service:

Multiple Hats by The Rev. Wm Chris Boerger, Bishop



In this ongoing series of articles I have reminded us that the election of a bishop is a call process and, as such, should be supported by Bible Study and prayer. I have also reflected on the travel commitments that come with the office of bishop. This month

I want to acknowledge the multiple hats that a bishop gets to put on in this role.

First, the office of bishop is a pastoral office. That means that the proclamation of the Gospel is the primary task. Calling the church to be the body of Christ in the world is central to the tasks given to a bishop. I have found great joy in the regular invitations to preach in the congregations of this synod. This is a high honor and a serious task for the bishop of this synod. I would have liked to have presided at the table more often, but I understand and appreciate the role of the local pastor in leading the congregation's worship.

Second, the bishop is the chief ecumenical officer of the synod. That means that regular contact with other judicatory leaders is important to this role. We are truly blessed to have a strong tradition of cooperation and communication between the Christian leaders in the Seattle area. The growing involvement of our Jewish and Muslim colleagues is encouraging. Much of this work is done just by showing up. The presence of the bishop at the ecumenical and interfaith activities is important to this synod and to our larger role in the faith community.

Third, the bishop is the synod's match maker. The bishop introduces potential pastors to congregational call committees. This role is one of the places where the synod and congregation can, and I believe do, work together toward strengthening the life of the congregation. Working to find candidates for call, who meet a Ministry Site Profile, is a significant part of the bishop's call. This work is often done by or with the strong support of the bishop's assistant. It is a task that requires multiple eyes, looking at possible matches in preparation for giving this work back to the call committee.

Fourth, the bishop is the synod's traffic cop. The responsibility of the office of oversight means that the bishop or the bishop's staff will be involved with a congregation at the time of conflict or when the discipline responsibilities of this church are required. This is never fun work. Listening and coaching are important qualities to share in these situations.

Fifth, the bishop is to cast a vision for the synod. On my desk is a "certificate" that I received for the former bishop of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, Roy Almquist. It quotes Augustine, Bishop of Hippo, "The task of the Bishop is to keep the Church alert until the Lord comes again." I have looked at it every time I sit at my desk. Through preaching, teaching and writing, along with one on one conversation, the task of the bishop is to hold a vision of Christ's church before the members of the church and before the world.

There are many other tasks given in the constitution to the office of synodical bishop. These are the ones that I have tried to prioritize as the ones that get my attention. Our next bishop will have to establish their own priorities. I pray for the Spirit's guidance for whomever you elect.
