Operation Brown Bag

Lunches are handed out Monday-Friday, 10 am—Noon to anyone who is hungry. Our volunteers try very hard to have a well-rounded sack lunch for this program.

The following items are typical of what goes into the sack lunches:

- Protein Small can of Vienna sausage, packet of tuna or salmon or a tuna or chicken salad lunch/cracker kit. (Must be able to be opened without a can opener)
- Fruit Fruit cup, applesauce or raisins.
- Drink Juice box, or pouch. Additional bottle of water, when available.
- **Dessert** Pudding or Jello cup or small pack of cookies.
- **Grains** Small bag of chips or package of crackers, and/or a granola bar.
- Care Items We always hand out individually wrapped hand wipes i.e. Wet-Ones. In winter/cold weather season we hand out handwarmers, gloves, hats and lip balm, if we have them available. During the summer/sunny season we hand out small tubes of sunscreen, if we have them available.

If you'd like to donate supplies, please drop them off on the <u>table</u> in Katie's Parish. If you'd like to MAKE lunches, please email/call the office to get starting directions. Lunches can be made at any time that you have time available to volunteer!

Vicar's Voice


Gone are the days of summer vacation for this Vicar. I was recently mourning this reality in my life as this will be the first time in my life that I will not have a summer break! That's what I get for being a perpetual student but even though I will not have a summer break you may be seeing me a little less this summer.

As you may be aware, my curriculum at seminary requires that I take intensive classes so that I can be your Vicar for two years. This curriculum change allowed the students to gain more contextual education with less time on the seminary campus. I have enjoyed this curriculum shift as it provides me the opportunity to create deeper relationships with each of you and to extend my learning process. Although this is a great curriculum it will require that I am back on campus for two weeks this summer, June 9th-22nd. I hope that you will keep me in your prayers as I travel and continue my learning.

As the program year draws to an end, we are very grateful for everyone who tends to so many of the activities around here. During the summer months, the following programs will take a time of rest and renewal: Sunday School, Choir, Book Brigade and Fruits of the Spirit Breakfast (there will still be coffee, though!). Our thanks to everyone who makes these happen.

HOUSING UPDATE

Walsh Construction Company (WALSH) is in the fifth month of construction on the Compass Broadview project. The framing of the interior and exterior walls for levels 1 and 2 are completed and work continues on level 3. When complete, the multi-family apartment building will offer 59 affordable dwelling units and 24 parking spaces in a below-grade garage. For now, we are so pleased to see the work moving along at a good pace and the housing looking more like homes!



BUILDING UPDATE

At this writing, Council is waiting on the second bid on the remodel. We are also in the permitting process for the remodel, in the meantime. We are moving forward in anticipating the renewal of the flooring in the sanctuary.

STEWARDSHIP LIVING

Science tells us that God has been at work on God's creation project — God's dream — for almost 14 billion years, with human beings and even the church arriving remarkably late on the scene. From the very beginning, God has been energizing the unfolding of reality as we know it, infusing matter with spirit or making spirit known through the physical. God's creation project is not fundamentally corrupt and profane (Genesis says it is very good!) so that our only hope is to escape from it. Instead, all of creation is sacred, sacramental, created in God's image and a means of God's grace. Jesus referred to this evolving reality as God's kingdom, and Jesus taught us to believe that the kingdom had already begun, and we would come to know it fully on earth as it is in heaven.

It seems, then, that God invites us to align our lives with the life-giving energy (love, grace, mercy) that is at the core of God's creation project and our very DNA. It turns out we are not passive recipients of a created order from long ago, but we are co-creators with God of God's new, emerging and better reality. Our mission, both individually and through the church, with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength, is to join ourselves to God's mission through creation, to be a conduit for God's love to make the world a better place. This orientation for our lives is not just a way to live but a better way to live and for many the way to the best-possible life. It is the way of Jesus, relational, full of meaning and purpose, that leads to abundant life and the life that truly is life. !

- 1 Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Lower Susquehanna, Delaware-Maryland, South Carolina, Southeastern, Montana, Sierra Pacific and Southwest California synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
- **2** Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Southern Ohio, Allegheny, West-Virginia-Western Maryland, Florida-Bahamas, North Carolina, Northwest Synod of Wisconsin and Eastern North Dakota synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
- **3** Pray that travelers, vacationers and students on break will be renewed in their faith, life, work and relationships through experiences of sabbath, rest and play this summer.
- **4** Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Upstate New York Synod Assembly, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
- **5** Pray our church continues to respond to the needs of Syrian refugees through the presence and work of The Lutheran World Federation and other partners, that people who have been displaced from their homes and countries devastated by conflict and war have shelter, food, access to water and sanitation facilities, education and skills training, psychosocial support and other services; pray for an end to this humanitarian crisis and a lasting diplomatic resolution of this conflict.
- **6** We ask God to stir in us humility, wisdom and eagerness to proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord through our faith and all we do.
- **7** Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Central States, Central/Southern Illinois and New England synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
- **8** Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Northwestern Minnesota, Southwestern Minnesota, Metropolitan Chicago, Western Iowa,

These petitions are offered as guides to prayer for the global, social and outreach ministries of the church.

Northeastern Iowa and La Crosse Area synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.

- **9** Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Northwestern Ohio, Northeastern Ohio, Northeastern Pennsylvania and Virginia synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
- **10** We pray the Holy Spirit will equip and inspire us to live lives that can't be ignored or go unnoticed, lives that cause people to ask who we are, what motivates us and how they too can share in our faith, joy and hope not for our own recognition, gratification or legacy, but for God's glory.
- 11 Vacation Bible schools, day camps and outdoor ministries share the good news of God's love through Jesus Christ with children and youth in neighborhoods and communities across the country. Pray for the Spirit to inspire and equip leaders, volunteers and outdoor ministry staff in their work with young people, that their impact will be deep and enlivening.
- **12** We ask God to grant us courage, wisdom and persistence in fighting racism, working for reconciliation and healing, and recommitting our church to work for racial justice and inclusion, to work against white privilege, and to be a church that truly welcomes all.
- 13 Give thanks for the service and witness of the ELCA missionaries and eight young adults serving in the Young Adults in Global Mission program in Israel, Jerusalem/West Bank, Jordan and Palestine, working with our companions to grow the church, support Lutheran schools and engage in issues of peacemaking, reconciliation and interfaith dialogue.
- 14 Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Grand Canyon, Northwestern Pennsylvania and Southwestern Pennsylvania synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's work in the world and growing the church.
- **15** Remember in prayer leaders and delegates gathered for the Northern Illinois, Upper Susquehanna, Caribbean and Metropolitan Washington, D.C., synod assemblies, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them for God's

work in the world and growing the church.

- **16** When life seems dark, our problems deep and insurmountable or we long for forgiveness, pray to the Lord and trust God's word, steadfast love and power to save.
- 17 Ask God to help us be attentive and receptive when we listen to parables, stories, metaphors and artistic expressions that catch us off guard, break through our assumptions, connect faith to daily life and deepen our understanding of God's truth and wisdom.
- **18** Remember in prayer parents and children during the summer months, a time when challenges of child care, hunger and meaningful, safe activities for youth can be complicated and acute; pray for wisdom and inspiration in creating services, programs and activities that support and strengthen families in your community.
- 19 Peace Not Walls is an ELCA campaign working for justice and peace in Palestine and Israel. Ask God to bless and further our work in partnership with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, The Lutheran World Federation and The National Interreligious Leadership Initiative on the Middle East to promote dignity, respect for human rights, mutual understanding among religions, healing and reconciliation in the Holy Land.
- **20** It's sometimes tempting to underestimate our influence and impact in the world as children of God, followers of Jesus. Ask God to encourage us through the presence of the Holy Spirit to be confident and bold in bearing the good news of Jesus Christ and living, acting and advocating for the well-being of all people and communities.
- **21** The ELCA and The Episcopal Church are committed to prayer, fasting and advocacy addressing cuts to public programs that are vital to hungry people who are living in poverty. Remember to pray for these concerns, our leaders and people in need on the 21st of each month through December 2018.
- **22** Remember in prayer the congregations, youth, parents, leaders and synods preparing for and traveling to the ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston.
- **23** Give thanks to God for the grace, new life and purpose we receive in baptism, and pray that remembering our baptism serves to keep us grounded in the good news of

our salvation and call to join one another in doing God's work in the world.

- 24 Pray for young people of color and those whose primary language is other than English who are gathered for the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event in Houston to celebrate their uniqueness, immerse themselves in Scripture, serve in the community, learn from teachers and elders, spread joy in fellowship and praise God who makes us one in the body of Christ.
- **25** Pray that The tAble, a pre-event to the ELCA Youth Gathering, blesses and empowers young people who live with a range of physical, cognitive and emotional disabilities that they might grow as faithful, wise and courageous witnesses.
- **26** Offer up prayers filled with thanks and praise for God's love, power and wondrous works for the benefit of humankind.
- **27** Remember in prayer the thousands of youth and adults beginning their experience of learning, worship, witness, celebration and service at the ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston.
- **28** Give thanks for the 12 ELCA missionaries serving in Tanzania with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania and its health care and education programs, theological education for leaders, and water resources and development work throughout East Africa.
- **29** Peter and Paul, Apostles Responding to God's call to follow and give witness to the good news of Jesus Christ, Peter and Paul left the familiarity of their occupations to become apostles who shared the gospel through their witness, preaching and writing. We ask God to so inspire us to be faithful and bold followers, witnesses and leaders sharing the light of Christ in the world.
- **30** Many seasonal workers of all ages serve behind the scenes and in roles with little recognition or appreciation during the summer. Give thanks to God for their labor and contributions to the community and ask the Spirit to move us to regard them with respect, gratitude, generosity and mutual hospitality.

40,000 of My Closest Friends

I am just coming off a wonderful pre-youth gathering event intended to prepare the 276 young people from the Northwest Washington Synod who will be traveling this summer to Houston, Texas for this ELCA's national youth gathering.

When I meet with the young people of our Synod I am both terrified and inspired. I am terrified because I am so disconnected from the world

that they inhabit – apps, language, movies, music, etc. I worry whether I can relate to these remarkable young people. Do I have something of meaning that I can bring to the table?

I am inspired because I am so very impressed by the young people who are formed by this church. They have hearts that care. They exhibit behavior that is fun to be around. Repeatedly my experience has been how respectfully they treat me and others. I love their global awareness and how at-home they seem to be in a world that, at times for me, is overwhelming.

One of the things that our young people have shown me is how they resonate to authenticity and honesty. They will put up with an old goat like me if I strive to live within my own skin and answer their questions honestly.

We had a "Stump the Bishop" session at this recent prep event. They asked fun questions - and they asked hard questions. Where was God when the holocaust took place? How can there be different interpretations of the Bible? Who was my first crush? Did I like being a parish pastor more than being a bishop? Which of my daughters do I love the most?"

They wanted honest answers - and I did my best.

The ELCA Youth Gathering will make a real impact on the city of Houston. Unleashing 40,000 students equals a lot

of worker bees - and I saw how much good can be done when we were last in Detroit.

The event also has the potential to have a major impact on our young people - helping them to deepen their understanding of their baptism and their vocational call. We will worship together, pray together, play together, and serve together.

One day of the Gathering is set aside as a Synod Day. During that time, I will again have the joy of spending time with our synod youth – and sharing my personal faith journey with them. It is indeed a privilege to have this opportunity.

Research shows that young people who have this kind of religious scaffolding, experience less at-risk behavior and are three to four times more likely to be involved in their community in the following ways:

Work on community projects

Volunteer associations

Vote in local elections

Attend Public Meetings

Donate time and money

So, June 27-July 1, think of me and 40,000 of my closest friends, as we will experience what it means to be the church together for the sake of the world.
