

Blessed be the holy Trinity, # one God, who opens the heavens and draws near to us with salvation.





the promise made to our forebears, to Abraham and his children forever.


Second Reading Hebrews 10:5-10

And this is what Jesus said, on coming into the world: "You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation prepared a body for me. In burnt offerings or sacrifices for sin you took no pleasure. Then I said, just as it was written of me in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I have come to do your will.'

In saying that God doesn't want burnt offerings and sacrifices—which are offered according to the Law—and then saying, "I have come to do your will," Jesus abolishes the first Covenant in order to establish the second. By God's will, we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once and for all.

Nicene Creed




